Callaway County Circuit Court, October Term, 1860.

In the Circuit Court of Callaway County, Missouri, on the Eighteenth day of October, A. D. 1860, the following among other proceedings, were had, to-wit:

Anton Ladman, Jo~~seph~~ ~~Kubicek~~ and Albert Frichs, natives of Germany this day came into Court and made application to become citizens of the United States, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court, that more than two years ago the said Anton Ladman, Joseph Kubicek and Albert Frichs made oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, that it was bona fide their intention to become citizens of the United States, and to renounce and abjure forever all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State and Sovereignty whatever, and particularly all allegiance and fidelity to the Government of Germany. And it being proven to the Court by the testimony of Henry Sartor and George Morell, citizens of the United States, who were examined on their oaths as witnesses, that the said Anton Ladman, Joseph Kubicek and Albert Frichs have resided continuously within the United States five years, and one year at least immediately preceding this application in the State of Missouri, and that during that time they have behaved as men of good moral character, attached to the principles of the constitution of the United States and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same, and thereupon, the said Anton Ladman, Joseph Kubicek and Albert Frichs made oath that they would support the constitution of the United States, and that they do absolutely and positively renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State and Sovereignty whatever, and particularly all allegiance and fidelity to the Government of Germany, and thereupon, the Court admits the said Anton Ladman, Joseph Kubicek and Albert Frichs to become citizens of the United States.
